- Black shoes or plain black trainers (no logos)

Nursery

- Navy blue cardigan/jumper with school logo
- White polo shirt
- Black or dark grey track suit bottoms
- Comfortable trainers or sensible flat shoes (velcro if possible)

- Navy blue shorts or track suit bottoms (in winter)

Jewellery
