Uniform Policy

Within our Granton Family we promote an atmosphere, which encourages effort, enjoyment and a celebration of the achievements of all our pupils. Our concern for these high standards is also reflected in the pride we take in our school uniform and the feeling of belonging it creates.

It is our school policy that all children wear school uniform when attending school or when participating in a school-organised event outside of normal school hours.

The uniform is part of our school ethos and in coming to Granton Primary School, parents agree to support our policy.

Aims and Objectives

Our policy for uniform is based on the belief that school uniform:

- Promotes a sense of pride in the school and it has a positive impact on behaviour and attitudes in school;
- Develops a sense of community and belonging towards the school;
- Identifies children with our school when taking part in out of school educational activities and visits;
- Is practical and looks smart;
- Makes children feel equal to others in terms of appearance;
- Is not distracting in class (as fashion clothes and hairstyles can be);
- Is regarded as suitable wear for school and considered by most parents as good value for money;
- Is designed with health and safety in mind.

Uniform with the school logo; sweatshirts, polo shirts, PE T-shirt and school bags are all available from our suppliers.

If any parents do have any difficulties then please contact the school for support and guidance.

Please ask the office for information.

Remember to mark any clothing with names. The school cannot accept any responsibility for misplaced clothing but, if clothing is clearly marked, will make every effort to see lost items are returned.

Please reduce the risk of losing property by ensuring that every garment or piece of clothing (including footwear) is clearly marked with your child's full name.

Daily School Uniform

Red Polo Shirt with Granton Logo

Blue Sweatshirt with Granton Logo (No cardigans permitted)

Plain Dark Grey trousers/skirt

Plain Grey or Navy tights

Plain White/Navy/Grey socks

Plain Black school shoes (Not trainers) Plain black winter boots are acceptable for poor weather (No fur, tassels, excessive buckles or patent)

Dark blue check summer dress and white socks (Summer term only)

Plain Grey shorts (Summer term only)

PE Kit

White T-shirt with Granton logo

Plain Navy shorts/jogging bottoms

Plain white/grey/Navy socks

Storage:

PE Kits should be stored in a drawstring bag that can be hung up in the cloakroom area. Each item should be named.

Swimming: (Pupils in Year 3)

One piece swimming costume/trunks/swim shorts (Not long/baggy Bermuda type shorts)

A swimming hat should be worn if your child has long hair, although any child can choose to wear a swim hat

Any child can wear goggles

Jewellery

For Health and Safety reasons we do not allow children to wear jewellery in school. The exceptions to this rule are one pair of plain studs in pierced ears and a watch.

Hair

Hairstyles should be reasonable and appropriate for being in a learning environment at school. Extreme hairstyles would include shaved patterns in the scalp, Mohicans and unnaturally coloured dyes. Such hairstyles are not acceptable at school. All children, girls and boys, are required to have their hair tied back, if long enough for PE. All hair accessories should be minimal and in school colours of red or blue.

Make-up

Make-up is not acceptable under any circumstances, including nail varnish. Fake tattoos are not appropriate at school and must be removed without trace. A child coming to school with fake tattoos will be asked to remove them.

Role of the Head teacher and Governing Body

The Head teacher:

- Implements and monitor the policy throughout the school community as part of the duty within maintenance of day-to-day discipline in the school;
- Has overall responsibility for ensuring standards are maintained;
- Is responsible for any disciplinary measures required for failing to follow the uniform rules;
- Issues letters to parents / carers as required.

The Governing Body:

- Should be receptive to any reasonable complaint from parents or carers concerning uniform, by handling it respectfully and considering fully the issues they raise.

Role of the Staff

The staff will:

- Dress appropriately; teachers and teaching assistants should set a good example in what they wear, avoiding clothing that is overly casual;
- Any tattoos should be covered;
- Jewellery should be kept to a bare minimum for health and safety reasons and to support our expectations for the children (piercings other than ears should be removed);
- Support the head teacher in maintaining high standards of uniform dress, including appropriate footwear;
- Make discreet and sympathetic enquiries when children fail to wear school uniform; Give positive encouragement to children setting good examples of dress.

Role of the Parents / Carers

The Parents will:

- Support the School Uniform Policy;
- Ensure children come properly dressed and ready for their daily schoolwork every day;
- Ensure all items of clothing are clearly named – this helps lost items be easily identified and returned;
- Parents and carers should raise any complaints about the school uniform by following the school complaints procedure.

Role of the Children

The Children will:

- Wear the school uniform when attending school, representing the school or when participating in a school organised event outside normal school hours;
- Wear the school uniform with pride;
- Try to keep their uniform clean and tidy;
- Remember to bring kit on the correct days.

Inclusion

All children have equal access to wearing school uniform regardless of their race, religion, gender, disability or ability. We ensure that the set uniform respects other policies

such as race relations, sex discrimination and allows for individual sets of circumstances of all groups and individuals.

Granton Primary School is committed to creating a positive climate that will enable everyone to work free from racial intimidation and harassment and to achieve their full potential.

Non-compliance with the School and P.E Uniform Policy

If a child breaches the school uniform or P.E uniform policy, the teaching team will discreetly talk to them to find out why they are not in uniform and to remind them of the need to wear one. If a child breaches this again a reminder letter will be sent home to parents notifying them of this breach.

If a child forgets their swimming kit, school will attempt to contact parents/ carers to bring a swimming kit to school immediately.

Collective praise for wearing uniform as well as reminders of the need to do so, will also be given to classes within assemblies.

The Head teacher may feel the need to contact parents / carers to bring some suitable uniform to school immediately. As an alternative to this, a supply of spare uniform will be kept in school and children may be asked to change into this.

We understand that there may be some exceptional and unavoidable situations where children may have to come to school without a part of their school or P.E uniform (lost or damaged) then we ask parents to contact us on the day to confirm the reason.

Persistent non-compliance: the Head teacher may contact the parent directly to discuss this matter. Continued non-observance of the policy will result in a formal letter and the pupil will lose 15 minutes of lunch time play.

Exclusion is not normally an appropriate response to breaches of school uniform / appearance policies. However, where these breaches are persistent and in open defiance of the school's uniform or appearance policy, and where all other avenues have been exhausted, then the school may consider exclusion as a last resort depending on the circumstances of the case.

Granton Primary School expects all pupils and parents to conform with this policy, but in the event of persistent breaches, we will work closely with the parents / carers to resolve the situation.
